Principles Before Personalities

"For our group purpose, there is but one ultimate authority- a loving God as He may express Himself in our group conscience. Our leaders are but trusted servants- they do not govern."

That statement is much more than a lofty sentiment- it is a reminder that God is to be in control, and not ourselves. How well we are able to implement this Tradition depends on a number of things, not the least of which is the character of those elected to positions of servant leadership. The group conscience is what is supposed to carry the day, not the will or the wishes of any individual trusted servant. We have seen far too many times where the Tradition is interpreted as an excuse to wield power "...but we're trusted servants- the group trusts us to do the right thing for them!" As it says in the Basic Text, this Tradition is meant to protect us from ourselves. We know from hard-won experience that direction and manipulation fail, yet time and again in our groups we run up against the "it's for your own good" mentality that so infantilizes us as a fellowship. If we do not wish to suffer the effects of the Law of Unintended Consequences, we simply must, as addicts, demand transparency and accountability from our trusted servants in every service venue, at every level. No longer can those of us in the member seat pass the buck- we will grow in our recovery only when we exercise our responsibilities and elect others to represent our groups who will carry a true group conscience to service meetings, and hold them accountable when they fail to do so. Service work is not to be about personality cults or charisma, but about a willingness to serve the addicts who are in the rooms and those who have yet to make it to them. Our job as trusted servants is, in part, to do everything we are capable of to see that the doors are open (maintain a good relationship with the church or organization whose space we are graced to use, and pay them the amount agreed upon), that literature is freely available, and that when issues arise that require our group's voice to be heard that it is in fact the group's voice and not our own dictates that are heard.

**“Group Conscience
is Agreement”**

The ultimate authority in Narcotics Anonymous is the will of a loving god being expressed in a home group. Group Conscience has nothing to do with ‘winners’ and ‘losers’, nothing to do with ‘arguments’ and ‘campaigns’ as one might suppose by watching an NA home group implement a vote. A loving god rejects the idea of power votes taken under the influence of ‘maximum clean time’. It has nothing to do with majority rules.

Group conscience is simply a decision by a group of people who deeply care that every one of them has had the opportunity to express ‘god’s will’ for the group, and who want each of those opinions to be present in the outcome. Every decision is based upon what WE as a group can agree. Imagine each of us quietly and respectfully discussing each idea on the table, and agreeing to follow through with those upon which each member of the group can agree, setting aside the ‘others’ to be considered at a later time? This is how a group gains ‘one conscience’.

The best thing we can do is stay in the light, because it reassures others there is a better life. And if others decide to cross the bridge, we will be there to cheer them on.

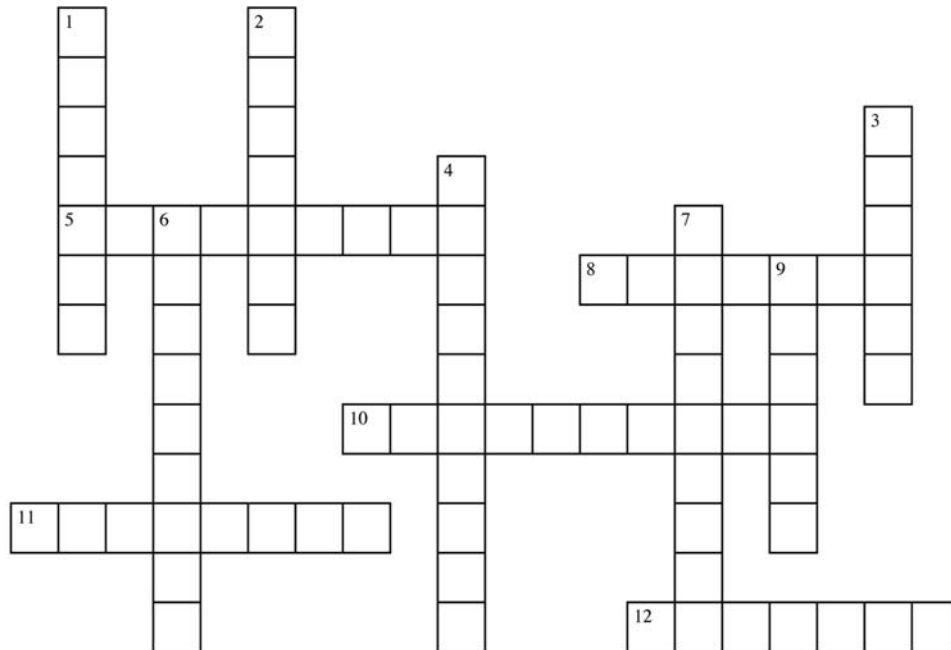
**“Our Freedom,
