

THE TWELVE STEPS OF NARCOTICS ANONYMOUS.

- We admitted that we were powerless over our addiction, that our lives had become unmanageable.
- We came to believe that a Power greater than ourselves could restore us to sanity.
- We made a decision to turn our will and our lives over to the care of God as we understood Him.
- We made a searching and fearless moral inventory of ourselves.
- We admitted to God, to ourselves, and to another human being the exact nature of our wrongs.
- We were entirely ready to have God remove all these defects of character.
- We humbly asked Him to remove our shortcomings.
- 8. We made a list of all persons we had harmed, and became willing to make amends to them all.
- We made direct amends to such people wherever possible, except when to do so would injure them or others.
- We continued to take personal inventory and when we were wrong promptly admitted it.
- 11. We sought through prayer and meditation to improve our conscious contact with God as we understood Him, praying only for knowledge of His will for us and the power to carry that out.
- 12. Having had a spiritual awakening as a result of these steps, we tried to carry this message to addicts, and to practice these principles in all our affairs.

It's addictive, ain't it? We use to live and live to use. Yes, that's right, I'm talking to you 13th Steppers out there. Why? Because I once was one too! It was fun and challenging, preying on some newcomer that just walked through that door or even someone that had been here awhile. Yeah, I knew what Love was all about - Sex. Right? Could I even imagine the damage I was doing or even stop long enough to care? Why should I? Everyone else was doing it. Or at least that's what I thought. Yep, I was even 13th stepped. Sounds like someone you know? This person walks up to me and says, "Hi, did anyone ever tell you hew pretty you are? I really liked what you had to say. Every time you talked it sent spiritual tingles through me. You're new, huh? Need a sponsor? A friend to talk to? Someone you can trust? Or do you like sport sex, casual sex or feeling lonely?" Well, I have all the qualities in the questions I've just asked you to help you along. Sure, I've been around here awhile. But, I can teach you all the right things. Does that sound familiar? Does that sound like me? Deni: 1 often keeps us from recognizing it. There's too much pain in looking at our past and changing who we are or can be. Do we want to change? Or do we keep doing that sick behavior we learned to like? It came to a decision for me. Do I want to be like all those turds in that big pile of turds or do I want to crawl out of that pile and be that person that carries the message of recovery for the addict that is still suffering or do I want to cause some more suffering? Do I want to be part of the solution rather than the problem? I think it all came to a head when I finally realized the damage I had done. But it took lots

of days, work and patience to know that I had a problem that could be overcome. I worked those steps and asked my Higher Power for the courage to let me love myself. That 12th Step says it all for me. "Having had a" sexual, I mean, "spiritual awakening as a result of those steps, we tried to carry this message to addicts and to practice these principles in all of our affairs." It sounds like a big order and I can't do it all at once. I didn't become addicted in one day, so remember - Sleazy Does It!! A silhouette against the setting sun draws near.


A form of a "Clipper" ship,

To those whom this does concern:

It has been brought to the attention of the trusted servants of the OSAGE GROUP that some individuals, in a few meetings have brought shame upon our group's name.

The individuals have made comments about people in treatment and those who have to have their papers signed. They've said that they are not welcome, that Osage groups was a club, that you have to pay dues to belong that treatment folks were requested to not show up at a certain time at another group, therefore were ridiculed, ect.....

We trusted servants wish to set this straight! Yes, it was true that these things were said. But this is not, I repeat NOT the doings of the entire group.

It is a disgrace to the entire recovery community, but more so to us since it happened within our groups walls.

Apparently these individuals have forgotten where they have come from, for many of us first were introduced to a 12 Step Program through a treatment facility or through a correctional institutional. It is one of our traditions which is being broken when someone forgets that our primary purpose is to carry the message to the addict that still suffers.

We are not sure whom this has affected, or how wide spread the word has spread about this disgraceful act, but we at Osage Groups wish to stop this virus before it goes any further.

We admit that this was extremely wrong of these individuals and pray that this will not stop the newcomer from entering into our doors. The Newcomer is THE MOST IMPORTANT person at our meetings, whether they come from treatment a correctional institution, the streets or out of their expensive homes.

We are not a club, we have no initiation fee or dues, no pledges to sign. We are a nonprofit group that is supported by donations from it's members. Many cannot afford to give money, money is not why we open our doors. We are seeking recovery, freedom from active addiction and a new and better way to live. We humbly apologize for these misconceptions given to the newcomer, and wish you to know that OSAGE GROUPS is for anyone seeking recovery from addiction.

And, to those personally affected and turned away, we at Osage pray that this will not keep you from seeking help and carrying the message of recovery to others.

THE TWELVE TRADITIONS OF NARCOTICS ANONYMOUS

- Our common welfare should come first; personal recovery depends on N.A. unity.
- For our group purpose there is but one ultimate authority—a loving God as He may express Himself in our group conscience. Our leaders are but trusted servants, they do not govern.
- The only requirement for membership is a desire to stop using.
- Each group should be autonomous except in matters affecting other groups or N.A. as a whole.
- 5. Each group has but one primary purpose—to carry the message to the addict who still suffers.
- 6. An N.A. group ought never endorse, finance, or lend the N.A. name to any related facility or outside enterprise, lest problems of money, property or prestige divert us from our primary purpose.
- 7. Every N.A. group ought to be fully self-supporting, declining outside contributions.
- Narcotics Anonymous should remain forever nonprofessional, but our service centers may employ special workers.
- N.A., as such, ought never be organized, but we may create service boards or committees directly responsible to those they serve.
- Narcotics Anonymous has no opinion on outside issues; hence the N.A. name ought never be drawn into public controversy.
- Our public relations policy is based on attraction rather than promotion; we need always maintain personal anonymity at the level of press, radio, and films.
- Anonymity is the spiritual foundation of all our Traditions, ever reminding us to place principles before personalities.
