THE TWELVE STEPS OF NARCOTICS ANONYMOUS.

- l. We admitted that we were powerless over our addiction, that our lives had become unmanageable.
- 2. We came to believe that a Power greater than ourselves could restore us to sanity.
- 3. We made a decision to turn our will and our lives over to the care of God as we understood Him.
- We made a searching and fearless moral inventory of ourselves.
- 5. We admitted to God, to ourselves, and to another human being the exact nature of our wrongs.
- 6. We were entirely ready to have God remove all these defects of character.
- 7. We humbly asked Him to remove our shortcomings.
- 8. We made a list of all persons we had harmed, and became willing to make amends to them all.
- 9. We made direct amends to such people wherever possible, except when to do so would injure them or others.
- 10. We continued to take personal inventory and when we were wrong promptly admitted it.
- 11. We sought through prayer and meditation to improve our conscious contact with God as we understood Him, praying only for knowledge of His will for us and the power to carry that out.
- 12. Having had a spiritual awakening as a result of these steps, we tried to carry this message to addicts, and to practice these principles in all our affairs.

MEDITATION & MAINTENANCE

Ah--occoooo-m-m-m-m-m-m-m-m-m...a universal mentra fucus of mystical meditations. Although the NA Basic Text mentions meditation in five distinct locations, NA cannot endorse, or lend it's name, to any particular discipline, nor impose a particular understanding of God onto an individual. With the sense of a "Catch-22," an addict in the lower steps of recovery may find to relate, or grasp, the concept of conscious contact in God a difficult task. My limited concepts of meditation allows me, in a sense, to appreciate you addicts who have tapped into your God's spiritual powers.

As an addict, I have attended NA for three years, and for the past year, with a patient clergyman, I have struggled to complete a comprehensive 4th Step. Just a shrt seven steps before I need to get serious about God interactions....WRONG! Newcomers are advised to prepare for the 11th Step by saying their "pleases" and "thank-you's" in each day's existence. When this basic main/enance is established, it evolves into moments of "prayer"—en indirect communication (conscious contact) with God. My mental response to a sponsor's suggestion to pray for all situations was —"too simple to be effective"—— Wrong! Now my prayers are more in grutitude for the grace shared with me by, and through, other people, in and out of NA.

I have written as a lower-member of the 12 Step totem pole, in hope other peers in the fellowship will react and heed to the insights veterans of the 11th Step may share with us. I invite those veterans to recall this own challenges for conscious contact with a Higher Power and the beneficial outcome in on-going recovery. Perhaps the veterans will excuse, and not discount, my seemingly infantile concepts of "How It Works."

When I got the phone call from a friend asking me if I could write something along the lines of 'Freedom to Live or The Newcomer, I was grateful that my sponsor just happened to be in town visiting. His words of wisdom still ring with me to this day. He said, "Pick One and Go For It." Thanks! I reflected on an experience that I had taking the step to recovery that he was aware of. I wanted his opinion on it, to see if it fit the theme or not. With that gleam in his eyes and serene "sponsor smile" he said, "Whatever." Oh I get it! Pick One and Go For It! so I did.

I am a addict, I am grateful for the Traditions of Anonymity. At about 90 days into clean time I was asked to come to an institution for "bad boys" and help carry the message. Ok, I showed up. I was scared. For the life of me I could not figure out why I was going into a penal institution on purpose! The memories of jail doors clanging, that infernal echoing down the halls and rattling of keys almost stopped me. But I did it anyway. Two other people with the same amount of clean time as myself and the chairperson with six years were already there when I arrived. Then ten kids came into this dingy, greenish room. They were from about 11 to 18 years of age, and came in all shapes, sizes and colors.

The meeting opened with four readings and birthdays. The chair-person started us off by asking me to tell a short version of my story. I was nervous, but once into it, some things that had been locked deep, deep, down inside me for years came rolling out. I did not "know" they were in me. My Higher Power knew, as well as where I could unload it. I was in the right place at the right time. When I was done I felt at peace, warm and comfortable.

After the meeting, I wanted to know how I could come back and get more involved. I went to the meeting again the following Monday and met the "powers to be." They explained that for someone to come on a regular basis they had to be at least 21

years old and have six months clean. As howcould see there was no problem with the age. I was honest with them and told them I only had 90 days clean. They said I could come back the following week but that would be the last time for a person can only visit that meeting three times.

I went back the following week and they asked me if I wanted to take over chairing the meeting on a weekly basis. I could not believe it! I did not know anything about H&I meetings but I knew I was in the right place! As it became part of my weekly routine, we got to know each other while learning more about the program. Some changes started to occur. We added the Serenity Prayer to the begining and the Lord's Prayer at the end of each meeting. Next we decided to elect officers. At the first business meeting they named the group, It is called The Freedom To Recover group. That really made me feel happy considering where they live, day in and day out. At the next business meeting they created a format and schedule of meeting rotation. What they voted in is the first Monday of the month is a step study, the second a caring and sharing, the third a Tradition study, and the fourth could be a business, speaker, or caring and sharing meeting. I did not know that an even bigger wonder was yet to come.

On occasion I would not be able to make it or find someone to cover for me When this happened I would call the "powers that be" and they would cancel the meeting for that evening. I hate it when that happens. One particular occassion I did not call.[I was wrong I admit 't.] The following week was when I learned of what happened the week before. For some reason the "powers that be" let these institutionalized youth conduct their own Step study, unsupervised! And it is my understanding that they followed the whole format with one exception. They had to choose a chairperson. I cannot begin to explain my joy and gratitude to God as I understand him for this experience.

I'd always been an outlaw, Doing things my own way.

One day the Lord looked down on me And said, "This boy must pay."

I have never been to a bad meeting. What I learned by attending the ones at this youth correctional facility in my home town is worth more than gold to me. I learned true Freedom To Recover comes from inside myself. To experience it, I have to get out of myself. Those young men taught me well. I received much more than I gave over the year that " I carried the message." To know in my mind and in my heart that no matter where I have been, no matter where I am, no matter where I am going -- The Steps, Traditions and Fellowship of Narcotics Anonymous work on the inside. Even when your on the inside. To me that is Freedom To Live. I am GRATEFUL.

THE TWELVE TRADITIONS OF NARCOTICS ANONYMOUS.

- 1. Our common welfare should come first; personal recovery depends on N.A. unity.
- For our group purpose there is but one ultimate authority—a loving God as He may express Himself in our group conscience. Our leaders are but trusted servants, they do not govern.
- 3. The only requirement for membership is a desire to stop using.
- 4. Each group should be autonomous except in matters affecting other groups or N.A. as a whole.
- 5. Each group has but one primary purpose—to carry the message to the addict who still suffers.
- 6. An N.A. group ought never endorse, finance, or lend the N.A. name to any related facility or outside enterprise, lest problems of money, property or prestige divert us from our primary purpose.
- 7. Every N.A. group ought to be fully self-supporting declining outside contributions.
- 8. Narcotics Anonymous should remain forever nonprofessional, but our service centers may employ special workers.
- N.A., as such, ought never be organized, but we may create service boards or committees directly responsible to those they serve.
- Narcotics Anonymous has no opinion on outside issues; hence the N.A. name ought never be drawn into public controversy.
- Our public relations policy is based on attraction rather than promotion; we need always maintain personal anonymity at the level of press, radio, and films.
- 12. Anonymity is the spiritual foundation of all our Traditions, ever reminding us to place principles before personalities.
