In the event of turbulence, the "feelings" light will come on, do not panic Sponsors will drop from the overhead compartment automatically. Please engage them, breath normally & work the steps or simply call them and ask for help.

If you're traveling with a newcomer, please work the steps first before putting the program on them. If for whatever reason we have to make an emergency landing over the "sea of confusion" There are Basic texts located across the hall. Remove them from the plastic simply open them. They are a great floatation device.

We have a new piece of safety equipment on board today. We have life preservers that are manufactured by a company called "ego". We have found that. this piece of equipment actually works better when you do NOT use it. It may, however, automatically deploy. Once again, I cannot stress this enough, please do not use the ego. Nothing is more dangerous in an aircraft than an inflated ego. If you notice that one of your fellow passengers has accidentally deployed their "ego", please point it out to them, but note "their first response may be defensive". We are delighted to have you on board. Please put your chairs in the upright position, & fasten your seatbelts in preparation for take off. Thank you for flying WSC airlines and we sincerely hope you have a great flight.

So do you remember when you went to your first meeting? If you do, I want to hear from you! I want to know all the details, from the hugs, to the literature, to meeting format ... everything! And I will start it off...

I had 31 days clean. I had ridden the bus to the next town over to seek out counseling for drug addiction. I finally found a place, NIDAP. So after I got done there, I was on the way home and ran into an old friend from school and from my using days. I was cordial. Little did I know that she was clean too. So we started talking and she said her mom was taking her to an NA meeting and asked if I wanted to go. I said sure. Of course I had no clue what it was, just help for addicts. So she picked me up and we went to the community center that Tuesday night, February 12th, 1989. We were walking up to the side of the auditorium and then there were a few more people. So I made my way to the

door. But before I made it through the door, a big guy; about 6'3; gave me a giant hug and said welcome. I will never forget that moment in time! Then I stepped into the room, filled with the little kids chairs: seriously, pre-school chairs. So I found one that looked somewhat comfortable after looking through all the literature and getting a meeting list. I got my welcome keytag that night as well as my 30 day keytag. The meeting was on the 4th Tradition. I don't remember anything specific that someone said, but I had a good understanding of autonomy after that meeting. The most time in the room was 11 months. I was in awe!! I loved it so much, I came back the next night! Plus, I kept coming back and still do to this day, 10,715 days
