The Google Maps based meeting finder is functioning well. There was an issue with the BMLT not listing all the meetings in a city under certain circumstances, and this appears to have been resolved, though I have not had a chance to do a complete test of the system. Many thanks to Texas-based N.A. members Tom K. and Chris M. for their hard work on this issue, and for their dedication in developing this wonderful tool!

We have a working events calendar with many, many fun things to do. Check it out! The Convention Pre-registration page functioned well, again, after a bug or two was exterminated. The Regional Meeting list is available for download through a link on the Meetings page, as are printable meeting lists for all Areas in the Region. These lists are updated as information comes in, as is the BMLT itself. I have noticed that some of the Area meeting lists are not being updated, possibly because no changes are needed. ™ Office/Storage Ad-hoc:

Hello all,

The contract with the Masonic Temple fell through as the organization in charge reported their insurance would not allow an organization to permanently store contents in their building. I explained we have our own insurance that does cover it but they would not change their stance. The Director did explain that they are very new to this and don't exactly know what they can or can't do.

I visited with the Marquette Public Works Director about the possibility of leasing part of their abandoned school; he informed me it would have to be presented to the city council, so I attended their next monthly meeting and gave a proposal. I was informed the next day that it was accepted and a legal proposal is being drawn up. This includes one large cafeteria room, one breakout room, one locked storage, positioned in between the two meeting rooms, that is large enough for a possible third small breakout, one full kitchen with ice maker, and two ADA restrooms with an optional third restroom in the kitchen. The proposal is for up to 10 days use for meetings, which adds two days outside RSC for other functions, the storage is full time. The annual amount is quoted at \$1,600.00 billed quarterly at \$400, due at the 1st of the month following each RSC. I have photos in a power point on my laptop if you want to see it. Marquette is 9 miles west of Lindsborg, 25 miles from McPherson, and around 30 miles from both Salina and Lyons, it has two diners and one grocery store that will be open both Sat and Sun. What it does not have is a hotel; the nearest one is in Lindsborg, where there are at least three. The contract will be presented to me March 14th, as the city council wants to look it over at their next meeting on the 13th. One council person works in Lindsborg so we will meet at her office. I can then show it to at least one other RSC member to look it over before committing to it, if needed.

I will be proposing that we accept this, and make arrangements to move all content from our current storage to its new location, if passes.

We will have an Online Tally ready in the next week or two. We will also make paper tally sheets available (see attached in minutes). Our plan with an acknowledgment from the RSC is that we will be collecting Tally sheets from Groups/Area and individuals.

Frankly, I (RD) was disappointed in the workshop as I felt most of it was spent reading the PowerPoint and repeating information that was widely available. However, it was nice to have some support. The FIPT details and the future of the WSC portions have some additional detail but that was a small considering the amount of hours of the workshop. The WB members got bogged down on the CAR and had to rush through the CAT which I received just two days prior to leaving for Lubbock.

Issues/Topics from Zonal Business Meeting:

- 1. Does the Regions want to help create guidelines that allow the Zone to budget ongoing projects that have been approved by the Regions?

Jon then asked what the expected timeline is for submitting reports, even though the Secretary prefers the weekend of RSC or next day, the policy states under Secretary Duties that they must have minutes out within two weeks of RSC.

Convention – Tony K., Lawrence, nominated out of committee. He qualified and was elected 2019 MARCNA Chair, congratulations!

- Estate Items: Daniel and Jeff met in Salina on NYE to inventory and split all of Brent K.s items in to three groups: convention, campout, and RSC activities. The full list is attached in the minutes. Daniel has all the boxes/totes at his house and will distribute them soon.
- Office/Storage Adhoc: Tim S., Ad-Hoc Chair, presented Motion 021818-001 to accept Marquette's proposal for the lease of three rooms in their elementary school, financial impact for all meetings, with tables, chairs, use of kitchen, plus long-term locked storage connected to meeting room is \$1,600.00 annual. Motion passed 9-0-1. At this time Daniel asked if Tim could coordinate the move before the May RSC. Tim will also create a flyer giving the new location, to be added to the minutes.
- Please note: Both Restructuring and Office/Storage Ad-Hoc committees have been dissolved as per Facilitator at the close of this RSC.
- MARCNA 2020 Bids: Much discussion on lack of convention bids, since some new people were in attendance it will once again go back with the hope a valid bid will be presented in May. Dusty mentioned Great Bend being revamped and upgraded, he is working with them to get a bid, this would only be possible since they are under new ownership (city) and they are quite aware of the problems the previous owner created. Tim mentioned that maybe we should look at changing the criteria of obtaining bids. Most contracts are based on food/beverage cost only, and room blocks are not efficient or prudent any more. Online sites can match or exceed the prices quoted to us, but we are not responsible for filling those blocks if we go that route. Currently, if the hotel claims we didn't match the block we are responsible for paying the balance, even if the hotel is booked full.

- Campout 2019 location: 2019 marks the 40th anniversary for the Mid-America Region and what has been labeled the 40th 4th of July campout, where the region formed. (*After RSC addition: Somehow the campout annual number got mislabeled at some point, 2018 should be the 40th annual campout, not 39th.) Daniel mentioned we should work hard to find a good place to hold it, as per conversation with Jon, it would be hard to plan for the same location this July will be held at, since it has never been there before. Jon then mentioned he has someone working on the Hutchinson fairgrounds, and Daniel mentioned El Dorado as having a nice facility. It was mentioned Wilson Lake has a new person in charge, so might be able to get back there. Wherever it is held, make sure it can handle the amount of people and enough electrical hookups. Regardless, this should be a big event.*
- Request for funds tabled in Nov.: Discussion from last quarter included moving \$300 from the general funds to PR escrow and fully funding one PR and one FD member to MZSS. The \$300 was needed for the upcoming PR presentation scheduled prior to MARCNA, and had minimal discussion. During this discussion getting a Treasury account made up the bulk, it passed with a show of hands. There was quite a bit more discussion on funding two members, one from PR and one from FD to the November 2-4, 2018 MZSS held in Omaha, NE. This is in addition to the RD and RDA being funded. According to Jeffry (RD), the cost could be \$750.00 for two if in one room, or up to \$1,000.00 for two in two rooms. Motion 021818-002 passed 9-0-1; both PR and FD will each select who will represent their committee.
