Mid America Newsletter (MAN) -

Hello family,

I got the 900 copies printed, 600 are going to MARCNA and the rest split to each area. Figuring out the budget for these printings at Office Max has proven to be a challenge; I had lowered the requested amount and thought the increase in quantity wouldn't affect it too much. The cost for this printing came out to \$363.37, or 40¢ each. Last year we printed 800 for \$258.39, or 33¢ each. In looking at all 2019 printing costs, it ranged from 28¢ to 79¢ per copy, all at Office Max. The highest cost per issue came with a 300 print run, the lowest with a 600 print run.

Once again, there were no submissions, so I dug deep in past issues. It's still my hope that interest will pick up with members wanting to participate with this publication. It has been an "on and off" issue for many years.

I mailed 10 copies of the winter 2019 issue to Hole in the Wall group at Oregon State Penitentiary, and plan to do the same with the current issue. I was hoping to hear back from them before I send anymore though, at least get a confirmation they received them. It will come to our region PO Box if they do.

Our laptop has been updated, cleaned, and loaded with complete Mid-America digital archives, which includes all MAN folders and files. I also donated a laptop case to help protect it better. It will go back to storage unless we find another use for it, I don't need it, but the next editor might.

Not knowing what RCMs will present for newsletter quantities wanted, I recommend we stay with 600 for all printings outside spring issue. I also suggest we keep the "NTE" request higher, maybe \$300.00.

The trip to Dallas was very educational about both the CAR and CAT we had two World Board Members, 15 member Regions of the 2 Zones meeting plus out of our Zone we had 3 Regions, and at least 2 Regions from the North East Zone, Minnesota region and one member from Alaska. Also, from the Southeast Region we learned why we are having a hard time getting rid of NA Groups who are no longer meeting in our Zone. Jeffry is working on getting that list from NAWS so we can work on that. The NA code writers who come up with BMLT are working on BEAM which is an app that can keep track of our special workers so we can get a hold of someone when we need to find them.

Also learned about the potential National Helpline I will be sending that information along with this report. Basically, the case study was done in and for North Carolina Region, they had lots of Area phone lines some listed as with names only, making since to those with the knowledge of local stuff. So, they are using a Tomato Aggregator that uses Crouton, BMLT, Bread, and Yap to locate and direct the addict seeking information to the correct area of the map. A single North Carolina Statewide number went live in August of 2018 and encapsulates the Service System to a geopolitical location. Nationwide, we have around 407 different phone lines costing \$250.000 to \$300,000 a year. How could we proceed? The list begins with.

- 1. Accountability

- 3. Technical Team
- 4. Other things?

More will be revealed

We learned about Accessibility issues and what their Zones are doing about it. IP # 26 "Accessibility for Those with Additional Needs" is out of date and some of those suggestions are even against the law. Their 2 Zones are using signers for all of their Zonal Meetings, Also I have learned of Never Alone Group which is a Deaf NA Meeting. Someone in our Region asked about signers in meeting last year, I had to tell them we started to use signers at our Convention awhile back and have since stopped that practice. We must ask are ourselves, Are those Addicts not worth it?

There were also some questions on Budget that I am still trying to get my hands on so I can explain it better. The WB members could not explain it and had to get Anthony to respond on it. I hope to have more information on that for the Sunday meeting. I will not be there for most of Saturday as I must work Saturday morning than attend a NAWS Webniar Saturday afternoon so see you in the evening or late Saturday afternoon.

Rod D. RD Mid America Region

Discussion:

There was discussion about a problem with a few people participating in sponsorship behind the walls. There was mail sent but it was not allowed to pass through the mail room, the people on the committee were under the impression that all was in order, for these inmates to be part of the program. Carrie E. asked if letters coming from inmates were being written to a PO Box and distributed afterwards. Daniel C. clarified that it was not a PO Box, but a physical mail box location that someone is checking.

Jeff R. said we currently have 18 inmates going through the process of being set up to participate, and we only have one sponsor from the Mid-America region. We are only adding a few inmates each month because of the lack of volunteers. The process for adding members is to make sure that these people want to participate, we send a package to the Chaplain or the Warden of the jail explaining everything we intend to do by providing this to addicts in jails, each new candidate has to do assignments on the Just For Today, and the Sponsorship IP's.

O There was also discussion on the RD report and what was discussed during the most recent Zoom (online) meeting for the members of the WSC. It was brought up that there were not many "decisions" made, but the Conference Agenda Track (CAT) was discussed at great length as the world board is projecting a large deficit for the next year. There was much discussion on the causes for the projected deficit and what this means, in short the world board says literature sales have dropped off earlier than expected and they are not brining in as much as they expected they would, they hope this will change with the new Spiritual Principles A Day book.

It was also brought up that the world board was still not able to discuss the ongoing litigation currently. There were many questions about what is happening with the litigation as a lot of the RSC was unaware of any lawsuit. As we have not been provided much information the WSC participants are supposed to receive more information on the litigation as well as the plan for the budget before the WSC meets. They sent out the information they had ahead of time to supply the regions with an idea of what was going on to let the fellowship know where NAWS is currently standing.

Synopsis of the litigation:

Rod D. a region that is not seated at the WSC, the autonomous region is named in the lawsuit, has filed with a court in California, to change the fellowship intellectual property trust (FIPT) because NAWS has not been taking care of the FIPT, the lawsuit has been sent to NAWS and they have been served this lawsuit. They are contending that NAWS has not been doing their job, and they are trying to break the FIPT and bring the trust back to the groups. The intent of the lawsuit is to break the FIPT.

Daniel C. the lawsuit says they want to remove NAWS as the trustee for the intellectual property trust. The lawsuit was brought to the Los Angeles Supreme Court by the autonomous region. Basically, all the information we will receive is the petition that was filed in the court, we have not been given a course of action or what is being discussed. At the WSC this will be discussed, and the RD will bring back the discussions. The autonomous region is made up of non-geographically represented regions. They are not a seated region, but they have a long history of being involved. There are many places they reside. It was filed in California by a law firm and signed by a member of the autonomous region living in California.

M Alt. Regional Delegate:

- Rod D. notified the RSC that the RDA will unfortunately not be able to fulfill his position and will be stepping down. Look to New Business for details.

Campout Guideline Policy Change

There was much discussion on changing the current policy for how the campout decides the location of the campout for the following year. Currently the policy is that the next campout location is decided at the closing meeting of the current campout. For 2020 this means that the campout committee will decide the location of the campout for 2021 at their closing meeting on the last day of the campout. The motion was brought forth as a recommendation to change policy, so that if the motion is passed it will go back to groups that the regional policy is being requested to change. If the motion is approved it will go back to groups, with the recommendation of how the policy wording will be changed, for groups to vote on. The groups will then bring those votes back to region and it will be voted on to either pass or fail the motion to change policy. It was also discussed that the motion will not go into effect IF passed until 2021. There was further discussion on taking the decision away from the campout committee, it was mentioned that Soul to Soul is currently operating in the same way the campout is operating, bids for the next years event must be brought to the closing meeting to be voted upon by the committee and lock in the decision. While changing the policy would change when the campout location is decided it was also pointed out that currently you can only reserve GROUP camp sites 8 months in advance. Carrie E. stated that this was the case for the 2020 campout location, they could not reserve the park until January 1st of 2020 for the event on the weekend of July 4th, 2020. While Soul to Soul's policy was brought up, the policy determining Convention was also brought forth to bring up that the RSC Business Meeting makes the final decision on where the convention will be held at the recommendation of the Convention Committee following bids. Clarification was needed from the motion maker to ask where the decision would be made, in the campout meeting during RSC weekend, or during the RSC Business Meeting? RDA Resigned:

As mentioned previously the RDA resigned his position. It was discussed that the Region has the money (\$2000) already in escrow as we had planned to pay for the RDA to go, we just need somebody to go now. There was much discussion on who we would send, we need to send someone who has experience at the WSC level and has a working knowledge of the current CAR and CAT to accurately represent our region on the WSC floor. It was also discussed that the decision of who is going needs to be made during the February RSC as we cannot wait till May to put somebody in the position. There were only a few members who had experience, and were caught up on the CAR and CAT enough to go. The question was posed, whoever we decide to send, what are we expecting from them after attending the WSC? Will they be elected into the position during February or will the just go as a filler with the title of RDA? As policy states this would fall to the Facilitator, or the Co-Facilitator of the RSC to go in stead of the open position. Policy also states that the RDA position must go back to groups before an election is held, therefore we cannot elect someone during the February RSC, but only fill the position temporarily for the sole purpose of attending the WSC. Jeffry L. stated he has willingness and is available to go but will not be taking the position until his RCM term is complete in October. Ben T. said he has willingness to take the position but cannot attend the WSC in May. It was asked if we would have to violate or overrule policy to send someone without electing them, it was stated that it is not a violation of policy to send someone representing the region as an RDA. It was decided to vote on sending Jeffry L. as our RDA without electing him into the position, and using the \$2000 to send Jeffry as the RD is funded by the WSC.

Sometimes an old story from days gone by can have a very fresh message, that's what I came across and just had to share with you:

Anonymity-a Way of Life

The word so many of us can't pronounce is a whole lot more than just using my last initial. It is a spiritual principle, synonymous with humility. Anonymity is where purity of motive belongs, the source of empathy and love. It's when I take one of my talents and use it for the fellowship, and they wonder, where did this come from, to whom does this belong, why was this done? Anonymity is when my HP smiles upon me and I remain selfless

Anonymity is a feeling inside me. When I break my back trying to run an H&I group, then one newcomer from that facility returns to meetings on the outside, my heart leaps for joy. When I realize I'm only one of many instruments which

my God uses for NA, I hug that newcomer.

Give, give and give, and when it hurts, give more. I have traveled far and wide taking addicts to meetings. They offer gas money, but anonymity for me is suggesting to them that there's only one way to repay me: One day just as I and those before me have done, take a newcomer to a meeting, no matter the distance. and make the same suggestion I have made. In my heart I remember when I was a newcomer, and I ask my HP to stay near those who once did it for me

Anonymity brings to light the fact that I am not just one individual person with a name. Every value, belief, thought and action was created in me. The person I am today is a multitude of addicts before me. If I wanted what they had, I did what they did. Today I see those results in my own life. Anonymity is never forgetting that the paved road I followed was also paved for those who taught me by those who went before them. And so we all in turn continue to lead. and continue to follow, serving as a continuing link to a family. It took a long time to finally

understand the paradox of anonymity.

It is true, no one addict or group of addicts will ever build my self-respect in the way my God does. There isn't a better feeling than only having his approval. So many times I have been hurting for time and money when I've been asked to be of service to NA. Anonymity is finding the time and money, no matter what. It is not letting the fellowship see that I am too busy. I can always improvise. Even if I have to count pennies for gas, I will drive a newcomer and mention nothing about it. I have an advantage--a car. If it weren't tor NA I never would have had one. My first year clean I saved as much as I could and paid cash for an old rusted out floorless, no brakes, no wiper or side-door jalopy.

Even in that case NA was there for me. The guys came over, and one fixed my muffler, another my brakes, another my door. After all the hours the NA guys spent slaving on it, making it road worthy, my only payment was

to do the same for another - that's anonymity.

My first year clean I owned eight Basic Texts! They kept disappearing. If an addict can't afford a book and they need it, let's hope it keeps them clean. Just buy another book.

If it weren't for NA I wouldn't have had my part-time minimum wage job to afford to buy another recovery text now and again. Then there's area and regional service. Trying to practice anonymity is a little harder there, but not impossible. As an ASC chair, I sometimes think *my* area, *my* subcommittees, *my* responsibility. "MY" area doesn't belong to me, it belongs to us. And we belong to a Higher Power.

My opinion is that Narcotics Anonymous saved my life, so I owe it my life. Maybe I'm a masochist, but there's no greater feeling in my life than the pain of exhaustion due to service work. I know in my heart that my God is pleased, and that's all that matters. No addict's approval could match his. I would like to say I practice humility as I understand it

often. If I did it would be a lie. I work towards it, sometimes falteringly, but I try. Anonymity. The spiritual foundation. I finally found something I can believe in.

A Silver Celebration

This year marks the Plains States' Zonal Forum 25th anniversary!

I attended my first World Service Conference in 1995 as an alternate RSR (now called RDA), and to set the tone for that year, we not only had the Conference Agenda Report, but we were also presented with two additional reports containing around 375 pages each. They were results and recommendations from an inventory that started two years earlier for world services. One was from the Composite

Group, which was made up of selected RSRs, WSC sub-committee chairs, Board of Directors and Board of Trustees. The other was compiled from an outside source, or independent consultant.

Back then the World Service Conference was held annually, so these reports were distributed within a month or two of the conference, giving little time to think about anything else. Opening day of WSC had scheduled board and sub-committee meetings in the evening, and allowed space for zones to meet if they wanted to. Tony K. our RSR from Dodge City, Dee S., RSR from Nebraska, and I had been talking about zones, weighing out pros and cons of joining a current one or start our own. We jumped around the various zonal meetings to get a feel for them, and while talking with members from surrounding regions during breaks, we decided to officially start a new zone. Tony came up with the name and I came up with a proposal for our regions, using a definition quote from the 1992 Multinational Development Forum

report. That quote later became the PSZF purpose statement

At this time there were nine zones worldwide. Zones outside the USA grew more rapidly. They served a need with the many countries that couldn't afford to send a representative to the USA every year to a conference. Here in the states it was different, most areas and regions were well organized, and frankly members rebelled against the idea of possibly adding another level or tier of service. Most couldn't supply enough resources, both financial and physical to add to the proposed addition. So setting it up as a service-oriented sharing session made sense. We also had Resolution "A" on our minds and what the future of WSC looked like, and felt zones might be in the right direction

Mid-America, Nebraska, and Colorado had never been a member of a zone, Show-Me and OK were members of Southern Zone and Iowa to Midwest Zone. We all agreed to at least take it back to our regions to propose forming the PSZF. Mid America RSC was the following month, or May 1995, and I included the proposal with my report, in new business it passed unanimously.

In 1991, Mid-America helped form the MRLD or Multi-Regional Learning Day, along with Nebraska, OK, Show-Me, and Lone Star regions. It was focused on H&I and PI efforts and was held annually. The 1995 MRLD was held in Kansas City September 22nd-24th and Donna R., Show-Me RSRA set it up for us to hold our first meeting on the 23rd. Members from Mid-America, Show-Me, and Iowa were present. Show-Me decided to stay in the Southern Zone, but lowa was on board. The Plains States' Zonal Forum became official!

We had planned to hold a 2nd meeting in Kansas over the winter, but instead waited until WSC '96, which is where Nebraska, South Dakota and OK joined. Best Little Region attended in 1997 and even hosted Oct. 1998 during their convention, but somehow neglected to make it official at

that time.

Midwest Zone, which formed in 1987, had finally reached a point of adding structure to their zonal meetings after the 1995 WSC. PSZF remained unstructured until 1998 when we decided to elect a Secretary/Treasurer, which I held until 2000. Best Little Region officially joined at the Feb. 2000 CAR workshop, bringing the membership to it's current six region zone. At the Fall 2000 meeting Secretary and Treasurer became two positions, Gilbert from Nebraska was elected Sec. and I remained Treasurer for another term.

Planning zonal meetings at established functions proved ineffective, so becoming structured was essential. Local fellowship had adapted by this time to accept this kind of growth. New elected positions were soon added, the zone utilized its membership and started setting up PR booths at professional conferences. A website soon followed and other projects like "Sponsorship Behind the

Walls" took shape. Plains States' Zonal Forum has prepared itself for future evolution, so, well done.

Congratulations on 25 years of spreading the NA message and helping NA communities grow.

Drawn up from the dark side of my personality, the dues of serenity in the light of a Higher Power are the love we share when we care the NA Way.

Possible resentments seemed to linger between us. Well, one day someone I really love in the program progressed into a rough area of their recovery and I was too emotionally involved to be of any help. The other person who I'd been having difficulty loving as a fellow addict, shared at a meeting and it helped the one I'd really wanted to help. They enjoyed the therapeutic value of one addict talking to another after the meeting and I began to

notice some changes. The serenity of the person I loved had improved and the hate I'd noticed between me and the other addict disappeared.

Now I find we do indeed need each and every one of us. We all have a much needed and necessary place to serve as members as NA. Yay, us!

Thanks for being here. I love all of you my fellow addicts. Whatever the price of loving you, it's possible to look at all of this as a clean bill of spiritual health from God. It's all a gift God's giving us. Without God's love of us, in and through us, there wouldn't be any love at all.






